Dear Ms. Inman:

The labeling referred to above, submitted in connection with registration under the Federal Insecticide, Fungicide and Rodenticide Act, as amended, is acceptable with the following provision(s):

Directions for Use section comment(s):

1. In the 3rd sentence of the paragraph starting with "For application to exposed skin," replace the word "and" with the word "an."

Storage and Disposal Statement section comment(s):


2. In the "PESTICIDE STORAGE:" subsection, replace the word "and" with the words "in an area that is."

To be eligible for reregistration, aerosol and pump spray formulations must be packaged in containers utilizing a concave trigger to help aim product or other comparable mechanism that will ensure that the product will not be inadvertently sprayed in the eyes.

The Agency is in the process of developing and improving the current Efficacy Assessment Guidelines for repellent products. The Agency intends to defer the determination of any related efficacy data requirements supporting the claims that may appear on this label until these Efficacy Assessment Guidelines are complete. When the guidelines are finalized, the Agency expects to issue a Data Call-In to address the revised guidelines to all registrants with registrations for personal repellent products that have not previously submitted efficacy data sufficiently consistent with the revised guidelines.

A copy of your label stamped "Accepted with Comments" is enclosed for your records. Please submit two (2) copies of the final printed labeling, incorporating the above changes, before releasing the product for shipment. If these conditions are not complied with, the registration will be subject to cancellation in accordance with FIFRA section 6(e). Your release for shipment of the product bearing amended labeling constitutes accepting of these conditions.

WARNING

READ AND FOLLOW ALL DIRECTIONS AND PRECAUTIONS ON THIS PRODUCT LABEL.

For Outdoor Use Only: Do not spray in enclosed areas. Never use repellents over cuts, wounds, sunburned or irritated skin. Do not apply near eyes and mouth, and apply sparingly around ears. Do not allow children to handle this product, and do not apply to children's hands. When using on children, apply to your own hands and then put it on the child. Apply only to exposed skin and/or clothing (as directed on the product label). Do not use under clothing. Use just enough repellent to cover exposed skin. Heavy application and saturation is unnecessary for effectiveness. If biting insects do not respond to a thin film of repellent, apply a bit more. After reapplying rubs, wash treated skin with soap and water or soap. This is particularly important when repellents are used repeatedly in a day or on consecutive days. Also, wash treated clothing before wearing it again. Use of this product may cause skin reactions in rare cases. If you suspect a reaction to this product, discontinue use, wash treated skin, and call your local poison control center. If you go to a doctor, take this product with you.

For application to exposed skin to repel mosquitoes, biting flies, gnats, and fleas: Hold 1-4 inches from the skin of arms or legs while applying with a slow sweeping motion. Until surface is slightly moistened. Rub with hand to insure even distribution. To apply to face and neck, spray in palm of hand in short bursts and spread on the skin sparingly avoiding eyes.

For application to outer surfaces of clothing to repel mosquitoes, biting flies, chiggers, fleas, and ticks: Spray outer surfaces of clothing, especially socks, shoes, pant legs, and undershirt.

Do not apply to synthetic fabrics such as acetate, rayon or spandex. May change furniture finishes, leather, plastics, painted and varnished surfaces including watch crystals, and automobiles.

STORAGE AND DISPOSAL

Do Not Puncture Or Incinerate!

PESTICIDE STORAGE: Store in a cool dry place away from heat or open flame and inaccessible to children. **PESTICIDE DISPOSAL:** Non-refillable container. Do not reuse or refill this container. Offer for recycling if available. If Pearly Flaked: Call your local solid waste agency or 1-800-CLEANUP for disposal instructions.
